Department Reports

Chief Kevin Baker, Shelbyville Fire Department, informed us that he is need of a mason for Fire Station 1, since the incident of the basement flooding during a water main break. The ladder truck has been repaired, and the bid process has started for replacing the 20-year-old truck.

Mayor's Report

Mayor, David B. Eaton, announced that on October 1, 2019, the Employee Banquet will take place at Red Orchard Park. The final fish fry of the year will be at Lake Shelby on September 21, 2019, from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. The second phase of paving is due to start the first week of October, in conjunction with the paving at the Parks. The August financial reports are in the council packets. The next council meeting will be on October 3, 2019 at 6:30 p.m.
