

Council Meeting – April 21, 2022

Mayor, David B. Eaton called the regular scheduled council meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. with the following council members present: Tom Hardesty, Pam Carter, Mike Zoeller and Frank Page. Absent: Troy Ethington and Shane Suttor.

Minutes –Public Hearing and Regular Called Meeting of April 6, 2022

Councilmember Zoeller moved to approve the minutes of the public hearing and regular called meeting of April 6, 2022, as read by the council members prior to the meeting. Seconded by Councilmember Carter. Absent: Troy Ethington and Shane Suttor.

All voted “aye” and motion carried.

Bid Approval – Warriors Way Sidewalk Project

Jennifer Herrell, City Engineer, received a bid from H & W Concrete, LLC from Georgetown, Kentucky, in the amount of \$69,571.25, and is recommending that the City of Shelbyville Council accept the bid.

Councilmember Hardesty moved to approve the bid. Seconded by Councilmember Page. Absent: Troy Ethington and Shane Suttor.

Procurement of City Police Vehicles

This is an emergency action for police vehicles. There is no fleet pricing at this time, and it will take several years to get new cars. There are three, pre-owned, demo Durango police vehicles with 90% equipped for \$38,000 available from Shelbyville Chrysler. We are asking council to approve the purchase of these automobiles.

Councilmember Page moved to make a motion to approve the request. Seconded by Councilmember Zoeller. Absent: Troy Ethington and Shane Suttor.

Resolution No. 2022-04-21/A Resolution Relating to the Request by the City of Shelbyville, Kentucky for the Issuance by the Kentucky Economic Development Finance Authority of Revenue Bonds to Refinance Costs Incurred by the Masonic Homes of Kentucky Obligated Group in

Constructing and Acquiring Certain Health Care and Health-Related Facilities in the City, Steven Gregory

Steven Gregory, City Attorney, read a resolution relating to the request by the City of Shelbyville, Kentucky for the issuance by the Kentucky Economic Development Finance Authority of Revenue Bonds to refinance costs incurred by the Masonic Homes of Kentucky Obligated Group in constructing and acquiring certain health care and health-related facilities in the City.

Steven Gregory, City Attorney, wants this to be on record that “The City hereby requests the issuance of the bonds by the Authority in order to refinance the prior projects for Masonic Homes of Kentucky. Such request is made solely for the purpose of satisfying the statutory requirement of the Authority for such local request and shall not be deemed to constitute an approval of the prior projects for any other municipal purpose of the City.”

The adoption of this resolution shall not be deemed to and shall not constitute an approval of the bonds, or any representation made by the Authority or Masonic Homes of Kentucky in the issuance thereof and shall not impose any liability or responsibility, financial or otherwise, upon the City.

Mark Franklin of Dinsmore discussed the resolution to the Council.

Councilmember Page moved to approve the resolution. Seconded by Councilmember Carter. Absent: Troy Ethington and Shane Suttor.

Chief Rob Rothenburger, Shelbyville Fire Department, stated that the department will be re-evaluating their fleet vehicle. On April 13, 2022, during the storm the department had 24 runs in a 24-hour span. They are still in the process of recruit applicants.

Chief Bruce Gentry, Shelbyville Police Department, advised council that Officer D. Chesser is back on the force after a long battle with COVID-19. The first week of May the department will have 2 recruits graduating from the academy. Sergeants Testing is in May 2022, and defense tactics training starts the week of April 25, 2022.

Janette Marson, ShelbyKY Tourism, indicated WHAS will be doing a story on the trolley and local areas of interest. The Dogwood Festival is coming up on April 23, 2022. There is a punch list that needs to be worked on at the conference center.

Darlene Snow, Shelby Main Street, advised council that they will be adding to the sculpture walk with 6 sculptures on loan for 18 months to 2 years. There will be a mural art piece in place in June. Main Street Week is May 9 – 14, 2022. On May 11, 2022, is the Youth Art Show from 5:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. at the Red Lion. On May 14, 2022, is Wild About Shelbyville Art & Music Festival. At the Barrell Room there will be the Bacon, Bourbon, Butter Bake-off which will be hosting a tasting from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. Taking place on May 27, 2022, Jarrod Andrews will be playing at Stargazer for 4th Fridays Concert Series. On June 11, 2022, will start the Saturday concerts; July 18, 2022, is the Jubilee; July 30, 2022, is the car show. On May 14, 2022, at 9:30 a.m. will be the plaque dedication on 6th Street.
