Minutes/Meeting of April 18, 2019

Budget Ordinance No.2019-05-02/An Ordinance Adopting the City of Shelbyville, Kentucky Annual Budget for the Fiscal Year July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020, Estimating Revenues and Resources, and Appropriating Funds for the Operation of the City Government – 2nd Reading, Steven Gregory

Steven Gregory, City Attorney, read and an ordinance adopting the City of Shelbyville, Kentucky Annual Budget for the fiscal year July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020, estimating revenues and resources, and appropriating funds for the operation of the city government.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

Eilene Collins, Shelby Main Street Director, indicated that the Youth Art Show is open to all students K-12. They may enter through their school art instructor or at Shelby Main Street. There is a new restaurant on Main Street called Gemma’s Italian Plate, open Wednesday - Saturday. Also, at 524 Main Street, Little Mount Lavender is having an open house tonight.

Jennifer Herrell, Director Public Works/City Engineer, advised that Discovery Boulevard has opened today, May 2, 2019. The City’s Spring Clean-up Week, April 8 – 12, 2019, was a success and hit over 270 residents, with six 30 cubic yard dumpsters. Mrs. Sherana Key started

on April 29, 2019 as our new GIS personnel. We are hiring for 3 employees for Maintenance Tech positions and applications will be available until May 10, 2019. Weissinger Hills Golf Course cart path paving will be taking place the middle of May into June. Milling will take place around 11th Street on May 6, 2019 and paving will continue Monday. The Council Workshop to discuss the 612-618 Main Street project will be on Tuesday, May 21, 2019 at 6:00 p.m., at City Hall.

Candice Selph, Human Resource Director, indicated the job positions have been advertised. Chief Istvan Kovacs' retirement party will take place on May 16, 2019, from 4-6 p.m. at City Hall.

Bryan Slone, Weissinger Hills Golf Pro, stated that April rounds were up from last year. The irrigation pump was installed. Mrs. Herrell updated about paving the cart paths. Bids for golf carts will take place on May 8, 2019, at 3:00 p.m. at City Hall. May of 2019 will be extremely busy with events at the golf course. We are accepting applications for Turf Equipment Technician.

Chief Kevin Baker, Shelbyville Fire Department, indicated that the entire bay at Station 1 has been re-painted. The station has had a lot of cosmetic work being done in anticipation of our 200th year anniversary open house which will be held on May 18, 2019, from 1:00 – 4:00 p.m. There will be an unveiling and displays of antique fire trucks. The department has a brand-new recruit class with five participants. The department has been extremely busy with runs.

Major Bruce Gentry, Shelbyville Police Department, advised that the public needs to lock their cars to reduce thefts. The Department's foot traffic has increased, and the bike patrol has been efficient in that area. Det. Kevin Calvert is still out with health issues. The department has sold two vehicles on govdeals.com. The department is finishing up with background checks.
