Street Paving bids will be opened on March 15, 2022. Mrs. Herrell is working with the Parks Department on paving the walking paths with ARPA funds. Mrs. Herrell is working on the Household Hazardous Waste and KLC Safety grants. Mrs. Herrell is also working on the replacement of City Hall's flat roof. The Fire Department bid will be held on March 10, 2022, for the training ground building. The Police Department project is almost finished. Bids for sidewalks on Warriors Way will be mid-March to April.
