

## **Council Meeting – March 17, 2022**

Mayor, David B. Eaton called the special called council meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. with the following council members present: Shane Suttor, Troy Ethington, Pam Carter, Tom Hardesty, Mike Zoeller and Frank Page.

### **Minutes – Regular Called Meeting of March 3, 2022**

Councilmember Carter moved to approve the minutes of the regular called meeting of March 3, 2022, as read by the council members prior to the meeting. Seconded by Councilmember Page.

All voted “aye” and motion carried.

### **Bid Approval – Fire Department Training Building**

Chief Rob Rothenburger, Shelbyville Fire Department, received a bid from Walter’s Building out of Lawrenceburg, Kentucky in the amount of \$149,620.00 for the construction of a fire training building. Chief Rothenburger is asking approval from City Council to accept the bid.

Councilmember Page moved to approve the bid. Seconded by Councilmember Suttor.

### **Bid Approval – 2022 Road Resurfacing**

Jennifer Herrell, City Engineer, received several bids and is recommending Mac Construction & Excavating, Inc. for the 2022 Spring Street Resurfacing Project in the amount of \$443,000.00. Mrs. Herrell is asking approval from City Council to accept the bid.

## **Department Reports**

Jennifer Herrell, City Engineer, reported that Shelbyville Clean-up is April 4-8, 2022. The banner on railroad trestle will be replaced on April 5, 2022. Bids will be placed in the newspaper for the repaving of sidewalks and paths of the Shelbyville/Shelby County Parks Golf Course with ARPA funds. Mrs. Herrell will also be placing bids for the sidewalks on Warriors Way.

Chief Rob Rothenburger, Shelbyville Fire Department, indicated that an ad for bids will be placed for ARPA funding for firefighter protective gear. Fire Station #1 will be closed on March 31, 2022 through April 1, 2022. The Department will be working at the other locations at that time. Fire Recruit testing will be April 19, 2022, which got approved by the State. There is a preliminary developing of specifications for a new pumper truck in the amount of \$600,000 for the 2023-2024 budget year.

Chief Bruce Gentry, Shelbyville Police Department, stated that the Police Recruits will be graduating the first week of May 2022. The Honorable Donna Dutton will be swearing in the officers at the academy. Officer D. Chesser goes for a follow-up and may be returning to the department soon after catching COVID-19. The Department has 8 body cameras. Also, due to higher gas prices, Chief Gentry is telling everyone to look out for gas syphoning.

Janette Marson, Shelbyville/Shelby County Tourism, indicated that Tourism is progressing with Web and putting things together. Mrs. Marson is excited about her new position.

Darlene Snow, Shelbyville Main Street, advised that the Youth Art Show will be held from 5:40 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. on May 11, 2022, through May 14, 2022. The Arts and Music Festival is coming along, and Ms. Snow will report on the Master Art Plan in the coming months.
