

Council Meeting – May 5, 2022

Mayor David B. Eaton called the council meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. with the following council members present: Tom Hardesty, Troy Ethington, Pam Carter, Shane Suttor, Mike Zoeller and Frank Page.

All present pledged allegiance to the flag.

Minutes – Regular Called Meeting of April 21, 2022

Councilmember Carter moved to approve the minutes of the regular called meeting of April 21, 2022, as read by the council members prior to the meeting. Seconded by Councilmember Page.

All voted “aye” and motion carried.

Proclamation – Building Safety Month – Mayor David B. Eaton

Mayor David B. Eaton read a proclamation declaring the month of May 2022, as “Building Safety Month.” Building Safety Month is sponsored by the International Code Council to remind the public about the critical role of our communities largely unknown protectors of public safety and encourages citizens to join in building safety activities.

Bid Approval – 2022 1/2 Ton Super Duty Truck

Jennifer Herrell, City Engineer, received a bid from O’Brien Ford, Shelbyville, Kentucky, in the amount of \$50,530.00, and is recommending that the City of Shelbyville Council accept the bid.

Bid Approval – 2022 Sport Utility Vehicle

Jennifer Herrell, City Engineer, received a bid from O’Brien Ford, Shelbyville, Kentucky, in the amount of \$32,491.21, and is recommending that the City of Shelbyville Council accept the bid.

Councilmember Hardesty moved to approve the bid. Seconded by Councilmember Suttor.

Procurement of Shelbyville Fire Department Vehicle

This is an emergency action for a Shelbyville Fire Department vehicle. There are no fleet pricing contracts. There is a truck available at Craig and Landreth Motors from Louisville, Kentucky in the amount of \$44,926.00, and the chief is recommending that the City of Shelbyville Council accept the bid.

Councilmember Carter moved to make a motion to approve the request. Seconded by Councilmember Zoeller.

All voted “aye,” and the motion carried.

Municipal Order No. 2022-05-05/An Order Amending Shelbyville Municipal Order No. 2020-06-18(A) and Revising the Holiday Leave Policies and Procedures Found in the Current City of Shelbyville Employee Handbook, Steven Gregory

Steven Gregory, City Attorney, read Municipal Order No. 2022-05-05/An Order Amending Shelbyville Municipal Order No. 2020-06-18(A) and Revising the Holiday Leave Policies and Procedures Found in the Current City of Shelbyville Employee Handbook.

The mayor has the authority to allow additional time for the employee to use the holiday leave or allow the employee to get paid for up to forty (40) hours of unused holiday time for a fiscal year. All requests must be made in writing and approved in advance by the mayor.

Councilmember Page moved to approve the motion. Seconded by Councilmember Hardesty.

Mrs. Herrell is continuing to work on the Police Station Addition/Renovation Project, Conference Center punch-list, Seventh Street Roadway Project and the Sixth Street Project. The bids for road salt will take place on May 24, 2022.

Janette Marson, ShelbyKY Tourism, indicated they are looking for trolley drivers. Froggy Radio will be doing a broadcast with tourism regarding Shelby County. Kentucky State Tourism will be here on May 18, 2022, visiting the city. On May 9, 2022, Whitney M. Young Jr., Memorial Highway will be renamed. On May 9-20, 2022, tourism will be hosting the local justice art showcase from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., at the Shelbyville Conference Center.

Barry Edington, Shelbyville Code Enforcement, implied that building permits are down due to a shortage of building materials.

Chief Rob Rothenburger, Shelbyville Fire Department, reported that Shelbyville Fire Department has an ISO rating of a Level 2 in the United States. This rating is good for 10 years.
