

Council Meeting – July 7, 2022

Mayor David B. Eaton called the council meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. with the following council members present: Tom Hardesty, Troy Ethington, Pam Carter, Shane Suttor, Mike Zoeller and Frank Page.

Minutes – Regular Called Meeting of June 16, 2022

Councilmember Carter moved to approve the minutes of the regular called meeting of June 16, 2022, as read by the council members prior to the meeting. Seconded by Councilmember Page.

All voted “aye” and motion carried.

Appointments – Mayor David B. Eaton

Mayor David B. Eaton recommends council approval of the appointment of Derrick Beckham to the Tax Appeal Board, filling the unexpired term of Jacob Gurney to expire August 6, 2023.

Councilmember Carter moved to make a motion to approve the recommendation. Seconded by Councilmember Suttor.

Mayor David B. Eaton recommends council approval of the appointment of Trace Kirkwood to the Triple S Planning Commission, filling the unexpired term of Dudley Bottom to expire December 31, 2025.

Councilmember Page moved to make a motion to approve the recommendation. Seconded by Councilmember Zoeller.

All voted “aye” and the motion carried.

Ordinance No. 2022-07-21/An Ordinance Amending Chapter 62 of the City of Shelbyville Code of Ordinances Relating to Alcoholic Beverages, Steven Gregory

Steven Gregory, City Attorney, read an ordinance amending Chapter 62 of the City of Shelbyville relating to alcoholic beverages. There was a one word change to corroborate with all other wording in the ordinance.

There was a small discussion on how the city addresses alcohol licenses.

Councilmember Hardesty moved to approve the motion. Seconded by Councilmember Zoeller.

All voted “aye” and the motion carried.

Stormwater Report – Mrs. Jennifer Herrell, City Engineer

Mrs. Herrell, City Engineer, summarized her annual Stormwater MS4 Report. Shelbyville was one of three cities the EPA chose to inspect in 2021. The MS4 Report is broken down into six categories: public education/outreach; public participation/involvement; illicit discharge/detection and elimination, construction site stormwater runoff and elimination; post-construction stormwater management, and municipal operations. The EPA chose to focus on public education involvement, construction site stormwater runoff and elimination, and post-construction stormwater management. The EPA reported back on May 20, 2022, with suggestions.

Steven Gregory announced that in the upcoming months he will be working with Chief Gentry and Carla Wainscott on updating the ABC Chapter 62 Ordinance.

Department Reports

Jennifer Herrell, City Engineer, reported that the contractor is working on the punch list and warranty items at the conference center. The Sixth Street Roadway Project, along with the installation of pedestrian crosswalk signage, is complete. The Clear Creek Pathway Project is completed with the finalizing of last invoice. After community requests, the Stargazer Plaza restrooms will be open to the public Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. for a trial period.

Janette Marson, ShelbyvilleKy Tourism, indicated they are working on visitor guides pamphlets, and website. They will be at the state fair in August 2022.

Darlene Snow, Shelby Main Street, will be hosting the JD Shelburne Concert on June 9, 2022, from 8:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. at the Stargazer Plaza. The Jubilee Breakfast will be held on July 28, 2022, at the Gatsby, and on July 30, 2022, ACT III will be playing at the Stargazer during the annual Cruise N Concert on Main Street. The Jeep Invasion will take place in September.

Chief Bruce Gentry, Shelbyville Police Department, stated that Officer Elzy will be promoted to Sergeant on July 18, 2022, with a reception following at 1:00 p.m. The department is preparing for upcoming events. The Pride Festival went extremely well. The forfeiture reports have been filed with the State. We have a few applications for police recruits. The department is also training on sites, visiting schools, etc.

Chief Rob Rothenburger, Shelbyville Fire Department, reported on weather safety precautions. Plats are coming in for Saddle Point and Discovery. The Fire and Police Department are in the process for Bus and Active Shooter training. Also, the department will be taking classes on School Mass Casualty and Drownings. They are extremely busy.

Mayor's Report

Mayor Eaton stated that Weiland Industry is coming to Shelby County. The news interviewed the mayor and was mostly interested in talking about the trolley. The mayor also advised council that Weissinger Hills Golf Course and Code Enforcement reports were included in their packets.
