Minutes – Regular Called Meeting of July 7, 2022

Municipal Order No. 2022-07-21/An Order Amending Shelbyville Municipal Order No. 2020-06-18(A), Which Adopted the 2020 Edition of the Shelbyville Employee Handbook, and Revising the Leave Policies and Procedures Found in the Handbook, Steven Gregory

Steven Gregory, City Attorney, read a municipal order amending Shelbyville Municipal Order No. 2020-06-18(A) which adopted the 2020 Edition of the Shelbyville Employee Handbook, and revising the leave policies and procedures found in the handbook.

In summary, the handbook needs to reflect the changes pursuant to Kentucky HB 345 amending KRS 61.294 and reflecting changes to HB 562, amending KRS 15.518.

Jennifer Herrell, City Engineer, reported that the Highway 53 Project hopes to be completed in November 2022. The paving project on Main and Washington should be finished in September 2022. The Household Hazardous Waste Event will take place in October 2022, and the Warriors Way Project ought to be finished in the next couple of days.

Janette Marson, ShelbyvilleKy Tourism, indicated tourism qualified for ARPA funding and will be applying for everything she is able to. She is currently working on fall advertising. A video shoot is coming up in the future. Her department is working on a website especially for the conference center. Hotel occupancy was 76.8% for the month of June. Restaurant Tax is up for Shelbyville.

Darlene Snow, Shelby Main Street, stated that the JD Shelbourne concert was a success. Four (3 new) businesses have opened in Blue Gables and one (1) on Main Street. The Jubilee Breakfast will be held on July 28, 2022, at the Gatsby and is sold out. On July 30, 2022, ACT 3 will be playing at the Stargazer Plaza during the annual Cruise N Concert on Main Street. On September 10, 2022, the summer concert will take place with Chad Meers performing. The Jeep Invasion will take place in September. Ms. Snow handed out pamphlets regarding the Community Mural Project, indicating that each tile cost is \$50.00.
