Resolution No. 2022-09-01/Resolution Regarding the ARP SLFRF Program and Funding for the Shelbyville Fire Department’s Fire Rescue Pumper Truck Project, Steven Gregory

Steve Gregory, City Attorney, read a resolution regarding the ARP SLFRF Program and funding for the Shelbyville Fire Department’s Fire Rescue Pumper Truck Project.

This is the adoption of a resolution of the City of Shelbyville authorizing and directing the mayor to execute any documents which are deemed necessary by the U.S. Treasury to participate in the American Rescue Plan State and Local fiscal recovery funds program and authorizing the mayor to have full authority on and to act as the authorized correspondent for the proposed project.

The City of Shelbyville will use up to \$750,000 of the funds provided by ARP SLFRF allocation to purchase a new fire rescue pumper truck, replacing the 2003 fire engine which is experiencing increased maintenance costs.

This is the adoption of a resolution of the City of Shelbyville authorizing and directing the mayor to execute any documents which are deemed necessary by the U.S. Treasury to participate in the American Rescue Plan State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds Program and authorizing the mayor to have full authority on and to act as the authorized correspondent for the proposed project.

The City of Shelbyville will use up to \$930,000.00 of the provided by the ARP SLFRF allocation to purchase new equipment and services to upgrade the VHF/UHF Communication System used by the police and fire departments.

Department Reports

Jennifer Herrell, City Engineer, reported the Household Hazardous Waste will take place on Saturday, October 8, 2022, from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. The Warrior's Way Project is completed and working on the punch list. At Weissinger Hills Golf Course, the paving project is waiting for drier weather. Mrs. Herrell is hoping to get the storage building project get underway at the conference center. Mrs. Herrell has applied for the Litter Abatement Grant for 2023. The Burks Branch Road Bridge Rehabilitation and the Lake Shelby Bath House projects will begin the bid process sometime in the Winter of 2022. The bleachers at Daniel Field have been removed at the request of Matt Mattingly, Shelbyville/Shelby County Parks, for safety issues.

Darlene Snow, Shelby Main Street, announced that Mr. Chad Meers will be showing on September 10, 2022, at Stargazer, which will be the last summer concert for 2022. The Jeep Invasion will take place on September 17, 2022, from 2:00 p.m. – 5:00 p.m. Also, the farm tour will take place on the same day.

Mason Warren, ShelbyKy Tourism, indicated the Conference Center is rented out except for 5 days in September. Janette Marson was at the Kentucky State Fair hosting the Shelby/Shelbyville Booth. They have 5 print ads. A journalist from Germany will be in Kentucky, October 5, 2022 – October 12, 2022. He will be in Shelby County on October 7, 2022.

Chief Bruce Gentry, Shelbyville Police Department stated that he had attended Recruiting and Retention School. There is a nationwide shortage of police officers. There are 5 recruit applicants who are in the process of background checks. The department has purchased 7 shields out of discretionary funds. The speed signs are on back order. In the next year, the department is expecting 3-4 more retirements. There will be an upcoming celebration of life for Officer Tommie Elmore.

Chief Rob Rothenburger, Shelbyville Fire Department, expressed his condolences to the Shelbyville Police Department on the of Officer Elmore. The recruit firefighters have 45 days left before graduation. There will be sign-ups for a new class starting the first of November 2022. The training facility's classroom is now complete.
