Minutes – Regular Meeting of September 15, 2022

Department Reports

Janette Marson, ShelbyKY Tourism, presented a report to council with current tourism statistics for Shelby County which they acquired from a research company.

Darlene Snow, Shelby Main Street Foundation, reported that currently there are 110 vendors for the Celebration of Lights, and 8 food vendors. The new sculpture that was initially set to be installed by the end of this year is now set to be installed by next spring. An artist is working on producing three ideas for the mural that will be on the side of 610 Main Street.

Jennifer Herrell, City Engineer, reported that the Household Hazardous Waste Event will be held this Saturday, October 8, 2022, from 9 a.m.-2 p.m. The Conference Center Storage Project is slowly progressing, the footers should be poured next week. The state paving project on Main Street and Washington Street is almost complete. They will be coming back to paint the lines, adding side driving lane lines and full boxes for parking spaces. Leaf pickup starts October 24, 2022.
